



These questions rock the Taningers' corporate empire and pit family members against one another when Laura investigates suspicious activities surrounding President Ken Martin's reelection bid.

Just the Truth: Study Questions

These questions are intended to integrate reading and writing to promote literacy skills by prompting students to recognize key themes, analyze competing ideas, cite supporting evidence, and connect individual rights with modern-day issues.

A thriller set in Washington, DC, in the near future, *Just the Truth* portrays the threats to a free press in an era of rising, unchecked government and the courage of one journalist who risks her career, her reputation—and ultimately her life— to investigate suspicious activity that might just manipulate the results of a presidential election. This newswoman, Laura Taninger, battles a powerful administration to keep journalism, a free press—and truth—alive.

- 1. Do you like the main character, Laura Taninger? What are the qualities she has that you admire? How has her grandfather, Julius Taninger, influenced her life?
- 2. How does the administration of President Ken Martin try to stifle Laura's investigation of the new voting system that will be used in the upcoming presidential election in which the president hopes to win a second term?
- 3. Laura Taninger and her friend Sean Browne are news anchors on competing networks, but they have two different approaches to journalism. What are they?
- 4. What motivates Clark, Irene, and Billie Taninger to oppose Laura's investigation?
- 5. Faced with the intense pressure from the Martin administration and from family members who are her business partners, should Laura give up her investigation? What keeps her going?
- 6. Describe the characters of President Ken Martin and his aides Darcy Egan and Zack Walker. What is their end and what are the means they take to achieve it? Does the end justify the means, as they believe it does?
- 7. Describe Reed Miller's character. What motivates him? What risks does he take?
- 8. How can economic regulations lead to the business community's being unable to criticize the government?
- 9. What are the threats to Kate Taninger's freedom of expression on her university campus? When an angry mob confronts her, how does Kate handle the situation? Do the dean's actions make matters better or worse for Kate and other students who want to voice their views on campus?
- 10. Discuss how an independent and free press is essential in protecting our foundational freedoms.
